AP COURSES (ADVANCED PLACEMENT):

AP Human Geography

Course Description: In this course, students will explore the patterns and processes that impact the way humans understand, use, and change Earth's surface. Geographic models, methods, and tools will help students examine the effect that human social organization and interconnections have on our world.

Requirements: Students must have an Overall 3.0 GPA and successful completion of English II or the equivalent.

AP Psychology

Course Description: In this course, students will explore Psychology, the science of behavior and mental processes which encompasses the mind, brain, and behavior and affects all aspects of everyday life. Students will examine the evolution of Psychology from its early beginnings to the cutting-edge research shaping our understanding of the science today. Students will think critically to evaluate psychological research and gain insights into ethical considerations that guide scientific inquiry.

Requirements: Students must have an Overall 3.0 GPA and successful completion of English II or the equivalent.

Important Points:

- AP Human Geography / AP Psychology is an advanced level course that has a high level of rigor, with more assignments due per week than in other courses.
- This course includes more advanced reading passages and longer writing assignments including several that are research based. In addition, many of the quizzes in the course are timed to prepare students for the style of the AP test.
- Students who select this as their Elective will be required to also select an alternative elective in case they do not meet the minimum requirements.
- Students may potentially earn college credit for this course at American universities. To earn college credit, students must schedule, pay for, and pass the AP Human Geography Exam in-person at a test center.
- AP Exams are typically offered during the first two weeks in May each school year.

DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES WITH DORAL COLLEGE:

Ent 1000 Introduction To Entrepreneurship / Mar 2011 Principles Of Marketing (Dual Enrollment)

Introduction to Entrepreneurship (first semester) explores the processes, skills, and attitudes that enable individuals to become entrepreneurs. Students will write business plans, learn how to obtain loans, permits, copyrights, and other resources. Students will acquire tools and experiences to help them in their professions and will review the challenges and rewards of a career in entrepreneurship. Students evaluate the methods of entering into an entrepreneurial venture and determine their roles in the future.

Principles of Marketing (second semester) is an overview of basic modern marketing principles, theory, and functions of marketing in the 21st century. Students will acquire a fundamental knowledge in the traditional and modern ways of marketing. Students will learn how marketers deliver value by satisfying customer needs and wants, determine which target markets to serve, and decide which goods and services serve the needs of these markets.

Requirements: Students must have an Overall 3.0 GPA, successful completion of English II, and a passing score on the Next Generation ACCUPLACER Assessment in Reading and Writing.

Enc 1101 English Composition I / Enc 1102 English Composition II

English Composition I (first semester): This is an expository writing course that emphasizes effective communication and critical thinking skills. Students will practice writing that reflects logical topic development in addition to appropriate style and grammar. Through their writing and their reading students will learn how the interactions among a writer's purposes, audience expectations, subjects, genre conventions, and the resources of language contribute to effectiveness in writing.

English Composition II (second semester): Students will engage in the careful reading and critical analysis of contemporary and classic American literature. Students will deepen their understanding of how writers use language to provide both meaning and experience for their readers by analyzing a work's structure, style, and themes, as well as the use of figurative language, imagery, symbolism, and tone. Students will write a documented research paper.

Requirements: Students must have an Overall 3.0 GPA, successful completion of English IV, and a passing score on the Next Generation ACCUPLACER Assessment in Reading and Writing.

Important Points:

- Dual Enrollment courses have a high level of rigor, with more assignments due per week than in other courses.
- These courses include more advanced reading passages and longer writing assignments including several that are research based.
- **There is an additional fee of €300 for Dual Enrollment (€150 per semester).**
- This course is accessed on Canvas via Colegia.
- **The Accuplacer Test Window will be sometime between March 21st and May 8th** and will be coordinated by Doral College.
- Students who select Dual Enrollment English as their Elective will take English V if they do not meet the Requirements.
- The Dual Enrollment courses are college level courses that are recognized by Florida public colleges and universities, in addition to a few other American universities.
